This has sparked many conversations and also gained a few "Thank you for serving" comments. Recently I was traveling back home after being away for a week and was waiting for my flight in Philadelphia airport. I was talking to a younger gentleman about many different things. His flight number was called and before he left he said "I noticed your hat, thanks for doing for me what I didn't do. I appreciate what all the veterans do for us". Usually the "Thanks for Serving" comes from another veteran or the family of someone that has either served or is serving. This man, however, had never been in the service nor did he have anyone that was currently serving. I am extremely proud that I had the opportunity to be part of a brotherhood that represents a very small portion of our citizenship.

The year 2011 was unique. Can anyone think why that is unique? On the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month in 1919, World War I was officially over. This was declared Armistice Day. This was to be the war that ended all wars. However, according to the Bible, there will always be wars or rumors of wars. This opportunity will not happen for another 100 years.
